

## SXSWedu® Reveals Latest Additions to 2016 Program

Third keynote, Launch competition finalists, Film lineup and more announced

Jan. 13, 2016, AUSTIN, Texas – SXSWedu® revealed a new swath of programming in the lead up to the 2016 Conference & Festival featuring the third keynote, Launch startup finalists, the complete Film lineup of educational documentaries and narratives to be screened at this year's event, along with additional conference sessions.

Joining previously announced keynote speakers Temple Grandin (Colorado State University) and Jane McGonigal (Institute for the Future), Ayah Bdeir, Founder and CEO of littleBits, will deliver a keynote address at the sixth annual conference and festival. Bdeir is one of the leaders of the maker education and open source hardware movements. Her work with littleBits and beyond focuses on using and advancing open source hardware to make innovative education a possibility for everyone around the world.

"Ayah's work epitomizes the creative energy that is integral to SXSWedu," said Greg Rosenbaum, SXSWedu Producer. "By celebrating invention and supporting access to innovative tools, Ayah highlights the importance of igniting the creative spark in all learners around the world. We're very much looking forward to having her join us for a conversation on the future of the maker education movement."

In addition to new programming arrivals, the SXSWedu Launch program returns with a new selection of education companies. The program focuses on early stage education startups working to enhance teaching and learning, and gives them a chance to compete in front of a panel of judges and a live audience. The 2016 competition, emceed by Guy Kawasaki (Canva) will include two rounds of pitching and judging, as well as preparation and mentoring with industry leaders. The judging panels draw insight from business, investment and the classroom and include Juan Cabrera (El Paso ISD), Sam Chaudhary (ClassDojo), Brian Dixon (Kapor Capital), Jose Luis Vilson (New York Public Schools), Sehreen NoorAli (Noodle Education) and Stephen Laster (McGraw Hill Education). More judges will be announced in the coming weeks.

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Additional announcements highlight new featured speakers Tim King (Urban Prep Academies), Steve Mesler (Classroom Champions) and Sakena Yacoobi (Afghan Institute of Learning), as well as the complete selection of Playground displays, and the full Film program lineup, including "A Brave Heart: The Lizzie Velasquez Story," "He Named Me Malala," and "Salam Neighbor."
