PQC's accomplishments during Sorrell's tenure include: winning Historically Black College and University (HBCU) of the Year; becoming the country's first urban work college; transforming the football field into the "WE over Me Farm" which has produced and provided more than 30,000 pounds of organic produce since its inception in March 2010. Sorrell was named one of America's "Ten Most Innovative College Presidents" by the Washington Monthly and is the only two-time recipient of the "HBCU Male President of the Year" award in history.

"President Sorrell's accomplishments in creating a new urban college model with project-based learning at the center is representative of the innovation we seek to highlight at SXSW EDU," said Greg Rosenbaum, general manager of SXSW EDU. "Seeing how he strives to ignite initiative and entrepreneurialism in his students is something to applaud and emulate across the country. We are proud to have him as a keynote speaker for the 2018 SXSW EDU Conference and Festival."

o DIGITAL NATIVES: Manoush Zomorodi is an award-winning journalist, published author and host of the podcast, "Note to Self". She will be joined by JP Connolly, director of technology and science teacher at Saint Ann's School in Brooklyn, New York. Together, they will host a session called, "Human Skills for Digital Natives."
