- One Woman's Vision: the Next Generation Elena Chacon and Daya Barnes, both Special Olympics athletes and students at Hendrickson High School in Pflugerville, Texas, join fellow students and Special Olympics partners Melchi Suresh and Kennedy Huschka, for a conversation about their work as the Unified Generation and how they are defining the future of Eunice Kennedy Shriver's mission to open doors for all people with intellectual disabilities.
- Break the Bias: Creating Opportunities for Girls Michelle Geddes, We Can Learn Chairwoman & Regional Vice President, leads a discussion about Edmentum's We Can Learn Foundation and its effort to positively impact women's growth and education, particularly through the #breakthebias campaign.
- #BreakingBias to Elevate the Teaching Profession Elisa Villanueva Beard, CEO of Teach For America, tackles the topic of why the critical profession of teaching is so

- underpaid and the need to continue building a community of educators that better reflects and serves America's diverse student population.
- The Power of Story to Teach/Transform/Tell Truths Rosa Rebellion Co-founders Virginia Cumberbatch and Meagan Harding come together with Dr. Sylvia Rousseau, advocate and Professor Emeritus at The University of Southern California, to share multi-generational insight on the connection between collective memory and racial justice. They invite attendees to participate in an examination of how we can all take part in an allied approach to challenging oppressive systems and narratives in order to strengthen education.
