• FINDING IDENTITY THROUGH POETRY, ART, & NATURE - Poetry, art, and place have the power to transcend generations and reinforce one's sense of self and connection with others. Join an original author, an award-winning artist, and an educator in conversation as they discuss adapting a poem into a picture book, the connections between poetry and art, and their power to impact readers of any age.

• **ELEVATING LATINO PARENTS IN EDUCATION** - Data shows that students perform better when their caregivers participate in their education, but Latino parents are often excluded from school decision-making processes. Now, Latino families are challenging the status quo in Houston, where Latino students represent 62% of the population, by presenting a unified vision for the change they want to see. This session will highlight advocacy work underway and how other school systems can create more welcoming environments for Latino families.
