

SXSW EDU® Announces 2024 Film and Performance Lineup

Creators behind such works as "Harlem Rising" and HBO-chronicled "Ranked" join the growing list of presenters at the upcoming Conference & Festival

[January 17, 2024] // Austin, Texas – The South by Southwest EDU® Conference & Festival has unveiled the screen and stage projects that make up its 2024 Festival program. From the complexities of experiencing a school shooting and the effects of forced displacement to investing in future changemakers and breaking the poverty cycle, this lineup invites audiences to examine the power of access for underrepresented communities. Through SXSW EDU's film program, attendees can explore how society, life, and education intersect. This programming is rich in content and has some exciting creators participating including *Butterfly in the Sky* star Levar Burton, a cameo by Sharon Gless in *Show Her the Money*, and voice narration by executive producer Freida Pinto in *She Creates Change*. And one other exciting note, *She Creates Change*'s campaign song "Who Am I?" Is written by Young Poet Laureate Warsan Shire whose poetry was adapted for Beyonce's "Lemonade."

"An important method for addressing systemic matters within education is understanding how they affect people to begin with. Storytelling, whether through film or live performances, helps us reflect, explore, and connect with those experiences and address often difficult or silent issues that many face. That's why the festival component of SXSW EDU has become so important to our community and to us," said **Greg Rosenbaum**, senior director of SXSW EDU. "Our 2024 lineup is particularly insightful in its wide-ranging coverage of past, present, and ongoing narratives, and significantly heightens several of the key themes and tracks making up this year's event."

Butterfly in the Sky

Butterfly in the Sky tells the story of the beloved PBS children's series Reading Rainbow, its iconic host **LeVar Burton**, and the challenges its creators faced in cultivating a love of reading through television. Two seconds into the bubbling synth sounds of its theme song will have a child of the 1980s or '90s exclaiming "Reading Rainbow!" Such is the beloved nature of the classic children's literary television show that introduced millions of kids to the wonder of books.

Como Vivimos (How We Live) Director: Aggie Ebrahimi Bazaz

Each year, hundreds of Latinx children across California are made to vacate their homes and miss months of school. Farming While Black

Farming While Black examines the historical plight of Black farmers in the U.S. and the rising generation reclaiming their rightful ownership to land and reconnecting with their ancestral roots. As the co-founder of Soul Fire Farm, **Leah Penniman** finds strength in African agrarianism – agricultural practices that can heal people and the planet. Influenced and inspired by **Karen Washington**, a pioneer in urban community gardens in NYC, and fellow farmer and organizer **Blain Snipstal**, Leah galvanizes around farming as the basis of revolutionary justice.

Using archival video footage filmed by Black and Brown youth from the '80s, '90s and early 2000s, *Harlem Rising* traces the history of the Harlem Children's Zone through the individual narratives of the children, parents, and community members impacted by its work. We Are Columbine

We Are Columbine is the first film to offer insider access behind and beyond the headlines of Columbine. The documentary highlights the stories of four freshmen students who survived one of the deadliest school shootings in United States history at Columbine High School in 1999. Director **Laura Farber**, who was also a freshman during the shootings, sensitively captures her classmates' unique perspectives during an unprecedented walk-through of the school itself, shedding light on the issues mass shootings represent to those affected and how to address them. PERFORMANCES:

SXSW EDU also welcomes an exciting list of poets, musicians, and artists to the live <u>performance</u> portion of its annual festival. Presented in formats ranging from an open mic to student musical theater, these performances push the conversation forward on issues of expression, mental well-being, relatability, and education. Featured productions include:

<u>Bigger Than Hip Hop: Why Folks Say it Controls Your Brain</u> – While innovation catapulted schools into the 21st century, it has minimized the importance of learning connected to the arts, critical thinking, social emotional learning, and civics. This workshop will take participants through an evidence-based hip-hop-inspired approach to teaching youth, followed by a performance by well-respected hip-hop artists.

<u>Knowledge of Self: Poetry Performance, Workshop, & Open Mic</u> – Infused with the energy of an open mic, this session will be enacted as a performance space. Designed to disrupt conventions that pressure educators and students to adhere to respectability politics, internationally acclaimed poets will open this session which leads into dynamic dialogue and the opportunity for the audience to share their work on the mic.

Ranked - A Musical of Identity, Pressure & Self-Worth – What are you worth? Who decides? And what do you do when it all comes crashing down? Heralded as the musical "that predicted the college admission scandal" (NPR's Morning Edition) and became the subject of the 2022 HBO documentary "My So-Called High School Rank," RANKED, A MUSICAL explores the intense and brutal costs of being a "successful" student in today's schools.

<u>Changing the Future of STEM Education with STEMusic!</u> – The STEMusic performance is a high-energy presentation that shares **Roy Moye III**'s journey through STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math). Roy takes his audience through a journey that covers his path to becoming an aerospace engineer while also showcasing how he created STEMusic to address the lack of black and brown professionals in the STEM Industry.
