SXSW EDU® Announces First Keynote and Featured Sessions for 2026 Conference & Festival

The Conference & Festival runs from March 9-12, 2026 and will take place across a new, more integrated footprint in downtown Austin, including a reimagined SXSW EDU Hub with more details in the map below. The initial lineup, including a range of leaders across fields such as tech, policy and advocacy, academia, and literature, will tackle critical issues facing education in the United States and around the world.

Announced Keynote Session:

Keeping Teachers at the Center of AI in Schools: Join Adeel Khan (CEO & Founder, MagicSchool AI)
for a Keynote discussing how millions of teachers are experimenting with AI tools. As a former
educator who has created one of the most used AI platforms in schools, Khan will share unfiltered
insights on what's working and what's not, and how to prepare students for an AI future responsibly.

- Word Magic: How Etymology Ignites Curiosity, Precision, & Joy: Jess Zafarris (Author of Once Upon a Word & Words from Hell) invites educators into the secret life of language and how the study of etymology unlocks interdisciplinary insight, stimulates linguistic curiosity, and builds bridges between learners and cultures.
- How State Constitutions Empower & Protect Youth: Erin Geiger Smith (Writer & Editor, Brennan Center for Justice; Author of Thank You for Voting), Celina Stewart (CEO, League of Women Voters), Harper Seldin (Senior Staff Attorney, ACLU's LGBTQ & HIV Project), and Julia Olson (Co-Executive Director & Chief Legal Officer, Our Children's Trust) come together to break down the role state constitutions play in young people's access to the ballot, the safety and autonomy of the LGBTQIA community, states' ability to respond to climate change, and the quality of state education systems.

- New Ground Rules: Rethinking U.S. International Education: Deneyse Kirkpatrick (President & CEO, Texas International Education Consortium), Vivian Walker (Co-President, Public Diplomacy Council of America; Practitioner in Residence & Professor, Walsh School of Foreign Service at Georgetown University), Jason Czyz (President, Institute of International Education), and Lawrence Schovanec (President, Texas Tech University) examine how higher education is adapting, what data reveals about these changes, what's at stake for the nation's workforce and innovation pipeline, and how international education shapes America's role in the world.
- Feeding Kids Like We Give a Damn: Transforming School Food: Mara Fleishman (CEO, Chef Ann Foundation), Norbert Wilson (Director, Duke World Food Policy Center), Rep. Jim McGovern (U.S. Congressman, Second District of Massachusetts), and Maya Miller (Student, Environmental Studies, University of Pennsylvania) explore how scratch-cooked meals, investments in infrastructure, and smart policy can transform school food into a force for equity, sustainability, and systemic change.
- Beyond Bans: Defending LGBTQ+ Stories & Literary Freedom: Casey McQuiston (#1 NYT Bestselling Author of Red, White & Royal Blue), Brian Bond (CEO, PFLAG National), Sam Helmick (President, Community & Access Services Coordinator, American Library Association, Iowa City Public Library), and Nadra Kareem Nittle (Education Reporter, The 19th News) discuss actionable solutions to preserve access to LGBTQ+ literature and stories amid discriminatory book bans.
- Exclusion to Empowerment: Women, Tech, & the Future of Learning: As Afghanistan's first female
 tech CEO and one of TIME's 100 Most Influential People, Roya Mahboob (CEO, Digital Citizen Fund)
 has used her success to educate and empower Afghan women and girls through technology. She
 shares insights from her journey and career creating new pathways in tech for girls worldwide,
 offering a vision for education that is inclusive, practical, and full of possibility.

Alongside the Keynote and Featured Sessions, SXSW EDU has added more than 15 conference sessions that cover the Conference & Festival's breadth of programming, including its five focal areas across levels of education and 12 tracks spanning future of tech, global initiatives, accessibility solutions, and more.

"This year, we will be taking on the most important and challenging issues facing education, our nation, and ourselves.
